## Thomas a Kempis, Massachusetts Centinel, 12 December 1787

A certain antifederal paper of Monday had the following DEFINITIONS.

"A FEDERALIST is a friend to a federal government.—An antifederalist is an enemy to a confederation: Therefore, the Friends to the new plan of *Consolidation* are antifederal; and its opposers are firm federal patriots."

Thus we see, Mr. Russell, the antifederal junto ashamed of their appellation, and wishing to remove its odium upon the federalists: But in vain is the endeavour—the Ethiopean cannot change his skin—nor the leopard its spots.
