

Pennsylvania Gazette, Report of Assembly Proceedings, 19 September 1787

Yesterday the frame of government was reported by the delegates of Pennsylvania, agreeably to their instructions, to the General Assembly of this state and read publicly in the presence of a large crowd of citizens, who stood in the gallery of the Assembly room, and who testified the highest pleasure in seeing that great work at last perfected, which promises, when adopted, to give security, stability, and dignity to the government of the United States.
